Above is my summary of the five Ofsted inspections which took place between April and September this year. I am extremely proud of the reports for each of the schools. There is a real recognition that our determination to give children the very best education and the very best personal development opportunities shone through in them all. Well done to all of you for the part you played in this achievement.

People Strategy

I spoke to you all at the beginning of term about our work to develop a People Strategy . The strategy is our approach to recruiting, retaining, training and engaging the very best workforce.

Circulated with this newsletter is the draft strategy, please do give feedback to your leadership teams if you think we have missed anything.

The Headteacher Board and I have been working with some external support to start to bring the strategy to reality. You may remember that we started this work with a staff survey and this has helped us in our planning.

Progress to date

We have improved appraisal systems to ensure that all staff are able to celebrate the work they do and also discuss their ambitions and next steps.

We have looked at ways of ensuring leave requests are treated in the same way in each school and we have tried to build in ways that we can add some flexibility into what is inevitably a fairly inflexible workplace.

People Strategy Cont'd

We are now advertising the option of part time working on all of our job adverts and we are part of a Flexible Working hub where schools share their ideas on this topic.

We have bought into the full professional development package from Haringey Education Partnership and are working with them to sort out career pathways for staff of different experience and with different ambitions.

We have bought into the enhanced Employee Support Programme for all our staff. You should hear more about what they can offer from your leaders. There is a lot in the package so do make sure you use it when required. Posters etc should be appearing in staff rooms, if they were not there before.

In the new year we will launch an employee benefit scheme. The scheme will enable you to access vouchers and discounts at various places and includes a cycle to work scheme. More details to follow.

The biggest challenge suggested in the survey was more joint working as a whole Trust. On February the 19th you will be able to attend a joint training day for all five schools. We hope this will be come a more regular event and that as well as training and sharing good practice you enjoy a day meeting each other.

Wilbury is an Early Excellence Partner school and we now have three 'Outstanding' Early Years provisions across the Trust. Mrs Chaloner (DHT Wilbury) leads on Early Years across the Trust and she works very closely with Early Excellence to provide exceptional training for staff at all levels. Wilbury hosted a very well attended training roadshow for staff across the local area in early November. Mrs Chaloner and Mrs Sengonul (Science Lead) also took part in a podcast for Early Excellence about high quality leadership and science in the Early Years.
